At this strength, it's almost like getting two whiskeys for the price of one. A great value, considering its age. (It's not identified on the label, but was distilled in 1993.)

Try to find a great 18 year old, cask-strength single malt scotch for this price. Very mature — with a good dose of oak — but not excessively so. Notes of toffee, tobacco, dark molasses, roasted nuts, dried vanilla, leather, and a hint of dusty corn. Dry on the finish, with lingering leather and tobacco.



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
