Bruichladdich Bere Barley 2008 50%



Bere is an ancient strain of barley which is stubbornly difficult to grow and mash. For this, Bruichladdich has gone to a specialist farm on Orkney. The nose is intriguingly aromatic, sweet and slightly corn-like, with a sweet nuttiness behind. It becomes very floral (night-scented stocks) with white currant, lemon sherbet, and a lift of tangerine before water brings out *sakura* (cherry blossom) syrup and bread. The palate is very sweet and concentrated. Remarkable. Keep
