Rather than big phenols there's an aroma of lanolin, sautéed scallop, fleshy fruit, and real sweetness. The palate shoes some oozing oils and a whiff of creosote, but this is a tea party rather than a wild *ceilidh*. Maybe bottling at 46% would have given the drive that's missing.



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
