

Duncan Taylor (distilled at Glen Grant) 1972 **Vintage**

31 year old, 56.1% ABV I don't normally like to add water to old whiskies, but this one needs a little at this strength. Whether you will like this whisky or not depends on whether you like woody whiskies with lots of sherry, and whether you care at all about recognizing the distillery character. The flavors are nicely balanced, rich, and very soothing in nature, but I struggle to find Glen Grant in here. Ripe fallen fruit, chewy toffee, maple syrup, honey-glazed almonds, damp oak resins-it's all there, and it's all balanced and quite entertaining. I personally want to taste the distillery character in my whisky. If that didn't matter to me, I would have given this whisky a higher
